Thank you, Marmion P&C, on behalf of I the staff and students.






Character Strengths

Why Character strengths instead of merit awards?

We know from decades of research that emotional intelligence, which is linked to an individual's character strengths, is just as, if not more important than IQ. What research does tell us is that IQ gets you in the door but it's the EQ that helps you to thrive.

It's no surprise then, that companies are now focussing more on these qualities in prospective employees. In fact, it is these 21st century character strengths that are changing the scope of employment criteria. The good news for schools is that character strengths are something that can be taught and learned. A focus on Character Strengths helps students to better understand themselves, those around them and why they do well in some areas of their life and not others. All areas of a student's success can be linked to their character strengths.



For example—

- Why did a student do well in completing a project (perseverance)?
- How can the student do better? (**Courage**) They may need to engage with something they find difficult and step outside of their comfort zone.
- A student who struggles to work with others may need to focus on teamwork or kindness.

Character Strengths also provides more informative feedback for students. Instead of teachers saying, "This is great work!" teachers at Marmion add "This is great work because you used **perseverance.**" or "You did well because you displayed **fairness** during group work." Ideally, we want students saying, "When I show **courage** I do better." "If I focus on my **self-regulation** I can contribute more during class and others want to work with me.

Other students also do not see the student who is doing well just as "smart". They begin to recognise that this student may or may not be smart, but he/she has strong **character strengths** that enable him/her to maximise their potential.

A focus on character strengths also assists students to set goals - "My writing is not improving. Therefore, I need to focus more on **creativity** and really brainstorm my ideas.

As teachers we may start to look at students a little differently. For example, Simon is a quiet, nice student, but he has never been acknowledged for **courage** or for **gratitude**. I could then work with Simon to set goals in these areas

This process is not just about the individual. Students can monitor each other within their group. They can clearly label or articulate when a member of the group is or is not exhibiting a key strength. At Marmion the goal is to develop a common understanding of the strengths and to use the same language, when working with students, colleagues, and parents.

Identifying students who have achieved an identified character strength is an important element of the process as it establishes the role models in each class and throughout the school. So, if a student has a particular strength they need to focus on they can look to a role as a clear example of the behaviours necessary to achieve that strength.

Although we identify the students who have developed a particular character strength with a certificate, it is important to understand that students are pursuing their character strengths not solely as a means to be rewarded or to please the teacher, but because they see personal and community benefits in doing so.



School visits

We have had a number of teachers from other schools visit Marmion to learn more about some of our work in mindfulness and character strengths. Without exception these teachers have commented on the strong culture within the school and the professionalism from all staff they came into contact with. I would like to acknowledge the work of the staff at Marmion who work hard to receive this feedback.

Marmion's Link to Culture



Culture

Marmion was the state's first marine park and was declared on 13 March 1987. The park has great natural beauty and is one of Perth's most important areas for aquatic recreation. The small islands of Marmion Marine Park provide important habitat for a wide range of sea life and plant diversity. The area is culturally significant to local Aboriginal people who have a long history of connection to the land and sea. The Whadjuk Noongar people are the traditional custodians of Marmion Marine Park. Prior to the end of the last Ice Age, the Western Australian coastline was about 10km west of where Rottnest (or Wadjemup) Island is now located. Noongar people lived on the lands that are now submerged in the marine park. The Whadjuk Aboriginal people called the area Mooro, gathered abalone and other shellfish in large numbers off the nearby reefs.



MARMION PRIMARY SCHOOL P&C

PROCESS FOR P&C FUNDING PROPOSALS

The P&C provides funding for numerous initiatives and projects around the school each year.

The P&C raises funds via our Fundraising Committee through a variety of events over the year, for example The Evening on the Oval, Mothers/Fathers Day stalls & Sports day. This is how we can provide funding to support the school.

If there is something you are passionate about that you think the school will benefit from or would like to coordinate an event for a purpose, whether it be new play infrastructure, IT equipment or recycling bins, you will need to submit a Funding Proposal to the P&C for discussion at a General Meeting.

We've set out a step by step process to assist in getting your Funding Proposal approved.

- Speak to the School, (first stop Mr Boylan our Principal) to put forward your idea, confirm the need and get their approval.
 When you have this, then...
- Research suppliers and try to get at least three quotes if it's an item you wish to have the P&C purchase for the School.
- 3. Liaise with the P&C to see if any grant opportunities would be available if applicable (e.g. could Lottery west provide some funding?).
- 4. Request the appropriate forms from the P&C for your funding Proposal to include the above information and confirm the content with Mr Boylan prior to submitting to the P&C.
- 5. Submit all relevant information to P&C 10 days prior to P&C meeting.
- 6. Be prepared to answer questions at the next general meeting to discuss your Funding Proposal.
- 7. Once approved you may proceed with your Proposal and ensure all receipts are provided to the P&C Treasurer for reimbursement of the approved amount.



Rest assured the process is not always complex and once the need and process is established, repeat approvals are often far quicker.
