### Curtin University Science Excursion

We got off the bus and went to a science introduction. The chemistry student told us the basics of chemistry. He demonstrated two experiments, one where it was based on water absorbing a powder and the other was a liquid changing colour to the speed it was shaken.

After that we went to a science lab and put all our safety gear on which included gloves, apron and safety glasses. We did 3 experiments overall. They were called sunset in a bag, paper chorography and lava lamps. The sunset in a bag was the first one we completed. When we added the liquids and substance to each side one turned hot, and one side turned cold. The second experiment completed was called paper chromatography. It was where we put Texta on a piece of paper and dunked it into water so the colour could spread. The last one we completed was my favourite was making a mini lava lamp by adding oil and food colouring therefore the oil is thinner, so it separated.

To finish off the awesome day we went to a large grass area and ate afternoon tea. After we all ate, we had a small play with the footy. I personally had a wonderful day and would love to continue science as my future By Gem Year 6

# PROCESS FOR P&C FUNDING PROPOSALS

The P&C provides funding for numerous initiatives and projects around the school each year.

The P&C raises funds via our Fundraising Committee through a variety of events over the year, for example The Evening on the Oval, Mothers/Fathers Day stalls & Sports day. This is how we can provide funding to support the school.

If there is something you are passionate about that you think the school will benefit from or would like to coordinate an event for a purpose, whether it be new play infrastructure, IT equipment or recycling bins, you will need to submit a Funding Proposal to the P&C for discussion at a General Meeting.

We've set out a step by step process to assist in getting your Funding Proposal approved.

- 1. Speak to the School, (first stop Mr Boylan our Principal) to put forward your idea, confirm the need and get their approval. When you have this, then...
- 2. Research suppliers and try to get at least three quotes if it's an item you wish to have the P&C purchase for the School.
- 3. Liaise with the P&C to see if any grant opportunities would be available if applicable (e.g. could Lottery west provide some funding?).
- 4. Request the appropriate forms from the P&C for your funding Proposal to include the above information and confirm the content with Mr Boylan prior to submitting to the P&C.
- Submit all relevant information to P&C 10 days prior to P&C meeting.
- 6. Be prepared to answer questions at the next general meeting to discuss your Funding Proposal.
- Once approved you may proceed with your Proposal and ensure all receipts are provided to the P&C Treasurer for reimbursement of the approved amount.


