Character Strengths

The most prevalent character strengths in human beings are strengths such as kindness, fairness, and honesty. One of the least prevalent is **courage/bravery**. According to the research from the Centre for Parenting Education, children need courage when they:



Try new things even if they are scared, like learning to ride a bike or entering a new social situation.

Keep trying to master a new skill even when they are frustrated, or other children laugh at their attempts.

Do the 'right' thing in difficult situations, like standing up for another child who is being bullied.

Admit to mistakes, like owning up to breaking a neighbour's window while playing ball and then apologizing and offering to help clean up and pay for the damage.

Having **courage** helps children to persevere against challenges, and in the process, it raises their self-esteem. When children feel good about themselves and see that they have the personal power to make courageous choices, they are more likely to lead personally satisfying and successful lives.

How can parents help children to show courage?

Parents are their children's first and most important teachers and, as such, have a powerful influence on their development. You can:

Make sure your children understand what courage is.

Define it and point it out when you, they, or someone else demonstrates it. Use news stories, television programs, movies, or books as learning tools.

Use everyday situations for your children to demonstrate courage.

Encourage them to:

stand up to peer pressure,

refuse to go along with the crowd when the crowd is doing something wrong or dangerous,

participate in a new class,

master new skills and persist in the face of frustration.

Praise your children when they demonstrate courage.

Highlight the positive!

Use mistakes as learning opportunities.

Do not use them as a reason to punish. Create a positive atmosphere that will encourage them to face and admit their mistakes openly and honestly. Teach them what they can do differently and how they can make amends.

Be a source of support for your children.

All people, and especially children, can better demonstrate courage when they know they are not alone and that someone "has their back."

Teach your children that sometimes asking for help takes courage.

Let them know that they don't have to face all difficult situations by themselves and that it can be a sign of strength to ask for help.

PROCESS FOR P&C FUNDING PROPOSALS

The P&C provides funding for numerous initiatives and projects around the school each year.

The P&C raises funds via our Fundraising Committee through a variety of events over the year, for example The Evening on the Oval, Mothers/Fathers Day stalls & Sports day. This is how we can provide funding to support the school.

If there is something you are passionate about that you think the school will benefit from or would like to coordinate an event for a purpose, whether it be new play infrastructure, IT equipment or recycling bins, you will need to submit a Funding Proposal to the P&C for discussion at a General Meeting.

We've set out a step by step process to assist in getting your Funding Proposal approved.

- Speak to the School, (first stop Mr Boylan our Principal) to put forward your idea, confirm the need and get their approval.
 When you have this, then...
- Research suppliers and try to get at least three quotes if it's an item you wish to have the P&C purchase for the School.
- 3. Liaise with the P&C to see if any grant opportunities would be available if applicable (e.g. could Lottery west provide some funding?).
- 4. Request the appropriate forms from the P&C for your funding Proposal to include the above information and confirm the content with Mr Boylan prior to submitting to the P&C.
- 5. Submit all relevant information to P&C 10 days prior to P&C meeting.
- 6. Be prepared to answer questions at the next general meeting to discuss your Funding Proposal.
- 7. Once approved you may proceed with your Proposal and ensure all receipts are provided to the P&C Treasurer for reimbursement of the approved amount.



Rest assured the process is not always complex and once the need and process is established, repeat approvals are often far quicker.
