Character Strength--Curiosity

One of our character strengths that we focus on at Marmion is curiosity. The Mayo clinic and the Via institute have carried out research in this area for well over a decade. It should not come as a surprise to learn that children are naturally curious and seem to want to know everything about the world around them. Giving children the opportunity to be curious and explore their environment is important for their development and well-being. Curious children are more likely to learn and retain information and stay involved and do better in school.

Here are 8 tips to nurture and develop children's curiosity:

1. Show them the world: Traveling, go camping, go to a museum or show them another culture.

2. Spend time together as a family: Go for a walk, bake a cake, or go to the park or zoo.

3. Encourage friends and family to give experiences rather than gifts: Kids remember experience, the excitement they felt in planning and the happiness afterward. Memories can last a lifetime.

4. Wonder aloud: Say out loud, "I wonder why the leaves on the trees are green?"

5. Encourage natural interest: If children are interested in an activity, give them opportunities to do that activity.

6. Ask open-ended questions : Use words like who, what, when, where, why and how.

7. Prompt thinking: When your children have a question, ask for their thoughts first before answering.

8. Let kids be kids: Unstructured play is a great way to nurture and develop your children's curiosity and sense of discovery.

By allowing your children to be curious and explore, you teach them confidence and appreciation. You also show them the world and teach them the value of experiences over things. Explore with your children, get outdoors, and learn about the world around you. Curiosity will always open doors and lead down new and exciting paths full of adventure and learning.


DONATIONS

PROCESS FOR P&C FUNDING PROPOSALS

The P&C provides funding for numerous initiatives and projects around the school each year.

The P&C raises funds via our Fundraising Committee through a variety of events over the year, for example The Evening on the Oval, Mothers/Fathers Day stalls & Sports day. This is how we can provide funding to support the school.

If there is something you are passionate about that you think the school will benefit from or would like to coordinate an event for a purpose, whether it be new play infrastructure, IT equipment or recycling bins, you will need to submit a Funding Proposal to the P&C for discussion at a General Meeting.

We've set out a step by step process to assist in getting your Funding Proposal approved.

- 1. Speak to the School, (first stop Mr Boylan our Principal) to put forward your idea, confirm the need and get their approval. When you have this, then...
- 2. Research suppliers and try to get at least three quotes if it's an item you wish to have the P&C purchase for the School.
- 3. Liaise with the P&C to see if any grant opportunities would be available if applicable (e.g. could Lottery west provide some funding?).
- 4. Request the appropriate forms from the P&C for your funding Proposal to include the above information and confirm the content with Mr Boylan prior to submitting to the P&C.
- Submit all relevant information to P&C 10 days prior to P&C meeting.
- 6. Be prepared to answer questions at the next general meeting to discuss your Funding Proposal.
- Once approved you may proceed with your Proposal and ensure all receipts are provided to the P&C Treasurer for reimbursement of the approved amount.
