MSN messaging

Marmion Primary has implemented a new system that will use mobile phone Short Message Service (SMS) to send text messages to parents/guardians/caregivers to notify them of an unexplained absence or late arrival of their child. SMS may also be used to provide information to parents such as emergency/unplanned events such as school closures.

Parents will be informed by SMS to their mobile phone each time their child is absent and an explanation has not already been provided to the school. If your child is absent and a reason has been provided before the time the SMS is due to be sent, you will not receive a text message.

Marmion Primary is introducing SMS communications to build on existing attendance procedures and to ensure that parents are notified as soon as possible if their child is absent from school without an explanation. This system has been shown to assist in making schools (and parents) more aware of where students are and improve student attendance. These factors will enhance learning opportunities for all students and contribute to their safety.

ADVANTAGES OF USING SMS TO COMMUNICATE TO PARENTS

□ Faster Communication

It takes a long time for school staff to individually make phone calls to each parent. By using SMS schools can get important messages to parents faster and can send a message to one or more people instantly. Parents can also use this system to notify the school of their child/ren's absence to avoid receiving a text message. The school can be contacted by SMS 24/7.

☐ Cost effective

It can be expensive, from a monetary and time perspective, for school staff to individually phone large numbers of parents regarding student absences. SMS communication to parents will be less expensive for the school and for parents replying via SMS. It also removes the need for parents to wait in telephone queues to provide an explanation for a student absence.

The requirement for the school to issue absentee follow-up letters will also decrease.

□ Emergency Message

If there is an emergency situation that requires rapid communication to parents this can be achieved using SMS. This communication would not usually be possible without the use of SMS.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT SMS COMMUNICATIONS

As a parent, what do I need to do?

You will be notified when the school is going to commence the use of SMS. If you know your child is going to be absent, please call the school well before the set SMS sending time which will be 10am every day. If you do not contact the school, the SMS system will automatically send you a text message advising you that your child is not at school.

If you do not wish to receive SMS communication regarding student unexplained absences, please contact the school to discuss other options for receiving this information.

How do I reply to an SMS message from the school?

When you receive an SMS about an absence, reply to the number and make sure that the text includes the student name, date of absence and reason for absence. Do not call the number as it is an automated system, using a virtual number which is not manned by a person.

Sample SMS Reply Message: Jane Citizen, 11 Feb, sick

What will it cost me?

Standard SMS charges apply, depending on your mobile phone carrier and plan. The cost of an SMS is usually cheaper than a local telephone call.

What if my mobile number changes?

Please notify the school immediately if your mobile number changes.

What if I don't have a mobile phone but I still want to receive messages/information about my child?

Please contact the school to discuss the available options for receiving messages/information.

What if I decide that I don't want to receive the messages anymore?

Please contact the school to discuss the available options for receiving information.

What if there is a custodial order preventing contact?

The parent/guardian with legal custody of the child must provide evidence to the school in the form of a court order for the school to legally deny a parent/guardian access to any information about their child.

What are the requirements for notification of student absences?

It is a legal requirement that parents contact the school regarding any student absences or reasons for lateness. If an explanation for the absence has been provided prior to 9:45 each morning, then parents will not receive an SMS.

Parents need to be aware that this system is an additional absence follow up service only. There will be times when parents may not receive a text message due to technical issues. In cases where you are concerned about your child's attendance, please contact the school directly on 9492 2300.

Split classes

Sometimes parents' express concerns when their child has been allocated to a split class and believe that it may be a disadvantage to their child. It is important that you, as parents, are aware that contrary to these beliefs there is no disadvantage to a student being in a split class.

Split classes are a practical response to the problem of uneven year level enrolments; for example, when there are too many students to form one 'straight' grade but not enough to form two. Combining students in this way is enables a solution that not only allows schools to ensure more consistent class sizes, but more easily match teachers to student need and maximise teacher funding and resources.

In years gone by split classes were formed by placing talented students in the lower grade level with lower achievers in the higher grade. This concept has long been abandoned. All classes are formed by teacher placing students with a range of information such as social cohesion, academic variations, gender balance and individual student needs.

A split grade class has no extra variation in the needs of learners than a straight grade. In fact, it is often a smaller variation in the split class. Each year the curriculum builds on the curriculum from the year before so, in order to cater for the different needs of students, teachers are consistently teaching above and below that year's curriculum requirements. Teachers must adapt the curriculum to suit the needs of individual learners within the classroom.

Experts agree the most important factor in determining how well a student does is the quality of the teacher and providing a 'differentiated' curriculum that caters to all children as individuals, according to their needs. Differentiation describes a concept being taught universally to all students within a class and creating related tasks at varying levels of complexity. When differentiating instruction in this way, teachers are providing for the needs of students at multiple levels of understanding at the same time which in turn allows students to see clearly not only where they are at, but where they are going. Differentiation occurs in every classroom at Marmion Primary School and children are taught in accordance with their individual learning needs.

What about socially? Children benefit enormously from having friends outside of their year group. It allows them to develop a wider group of friends which gives them more options in the playground, greater connections across the school and can benefit them within the wider community. It helps them build social skills which has long term effects for building resiliency.

PROCESS FOR P&C FUNDING PROPOSALS

The P&C provides funding for numerous initiatives and projects around the school each year.

The P&C raises funds via our Fundraising Committee through a variety of events over the year, for example The Evening on the Oval, Mothers/Fathers Day stalls & Sports day. This is how we can provide funding to support the school.

If there is something you are passionate about that you think the school will benefit from or would like to coordinate an event for a purpose, whether it be new play infrastructure, IT equipment or recycling bins, you will need to submit a Funding Proposal to the P&C for discussion at a General Meeting.

We've set out a step by step process to assist in getting your Funding Proposal approved.

- Speak to the School, (first stop Mr Boylan our Principal) to put forward your idea, confirm the need and get their approval.
 When you have this, then...
- Research suppliers and try to get at least three quotes if it's an item you wish to have the P&C purchase for the School.
- 3. Liaise with the P&C to see if any grant opportunities would be available if applicable (e.g. could Lottery west provide some funding?).
- 4. Request the appropriate forms from the P&C for your funding Proposal to include the above information and confirm the content with Mr Boylan prior to submitting to the P&C.
- 5. Submit all relevant information to P&C 10 days prior to P&C meeting.
- 6. Be prepared to answer questions at the next general meeting to discuss your Funding Proposal.
- 7. Once approved you may proceed with your Proposal and ensure all receipts are provided to the P&C Treasurer for reimbursement of the approved amount.



Rest assured the process is not always complex and once the need and process is established, repeat approvals are often far quicker.
